COUNTDOWN TO COP 26

The rescheduled United Nations Climate Change Conference is scheduled to be held in Glasgow from 1 - 12 November 2021. This time next year the UK and Italy will be hosting the most significant climate event since the 2015 Paris Agreement when 195 countries agreed that they must:

- Reduce the amount of harmful gas production and increase renewable types of energy
- Keep global temperature increase "well below" 2C and try to limit it to 1.5C
- Review progress on the agreement every five years.
- Spend \$100 million annually in climate finance to help poorer countries (and commit to further finance in the future).
